General Outline for Penalty System Emplaced by the European Aerospace Forces Coalition for Helldiver Squadron Offensive Tactical Force

Penalty Outline:

- If a HSOTF pilot fails to carry out the orders given, he or she will receive the following penalties:
 - A tally, which is a visual mark on a page only accessible via password on the HSOTF website. This tally signifies a count towards the final round, 5, and can mean the displacement and/or discharge of the officer.
 - 2) The officer will be charged with a tardy, and will be obligated to file a brief summary to the <u>HSOTF Central Command</u> describing the reason(s) for the tardiness and unsuccessful mission.
- If a HSOTF pilot fails to file a report on the status of the mission and verify that <u>all</u> orders have been executed, he or she will receive the following penalties:
 - 1) A tally, as described above.
 - 2) The pilot will receive **no** credit for the completed mission.
 - 3) Central Command will not recognize the pilot's success.
 - 4) Central Command will issue a brief warning to the HSOTF pilot summarizing the problem(s), and the pilot is expected to act without hesitation on the next issued mission.

- If a HSOTF pilot completes the mission but fails to achieve the objective, he or she will not be tallied for a failed mission. Failure only occurs if the pilot is shot down or fails to comply with executive orders.
- If a HSOTF pilot succeeds and **completes** the mission without any setbacks, he or she will be entitled to the following steps:
 - 1) A tally taken away, if any.
 - 2) A Marc, which is a visual mark accessible to the public and not password protected, will be issued to the pilot. The Marc is a tally system which defines forward movement, or progress, and is *not* the same as the tally.
 - 3) Marcs must add to 3 to gain a new rank.
 - 4) Marcs must add to 5 to gain a new rank once the rank has reached E-7, or Master Sergeant. Master Sergeant is a noncommissioned rank.
 - 5) Marcs must add to 7 to gain a new rank once the rank has reached O-3, or Captain.
 Captain is a commissioned officer rank.
 - 6) Marcs must add to 10 to gain a new rank once the rank has reached O-6, or Colonel.

 Colonel is a field officer rank.
 - 7) Marcs can continue to be added to the pilot's count, but there is no rank available past O-10, or General. General is a general officer.

KEY:

Tally: a negative mark on a member's count regarding missions and reports.

Marc: a positive mark on a member's count regarding missions and reports. Marcs are kept on a separate count.

Tally take-back: tally take-back *only* occurs if there are tallies on the member's count preventing Marcs from being added. There must be 0 tallies before Marcs can be added.

HSOTF Recognition:

It is essential that the pilot understands the basic system—the pilot *only* gains Marcs *after* he/she eliminates *all* tallies.

e.g.

If there are 3 tallies, but the pilot just completed a mission successfully and executed all orders and he/she earned Marcs accordingly (in this case we will say the mission was worth 5 Marcs, a hard mission) then the pilot would "take-back' those 3 and add 2, thus making the final count:

0 tallies

2 Marcs

Think of it as a number line. Tallies are negative numbers, and Marcs are positive. In the example above, the pilot has -3. Then he/she earned +5. Add +5 to -3. The solution is +2, making +2 Marcs.
